Progression: Full Major Award in Horticulture CASHX	Specific Entry/Access and Exemptions Requirements: Level 4 or equivalent and or prior learning experience. Participants may wish to apply for exemption from parts of this programme based on prior learning experience, valid and reliable evidence will need to be provided.
Duration: This programme will run for 5 contact days and will require participants to complete some work in their own time.	Who should attend this course: Those planning to work in the horticulture industry or those with experience looking to gain formal accreditation.
Required fluency in generic skills such as literacy/numeracy/interpersonal skills: Participants entering onto this programme will usually be proficient at reading, drafting, preparing and understanding information across a broad range of topics, solve predictable problems well independently and as part of a group.	
FETAC Assessment: Participants who wish to achieve a FETAC Component Certificate must complete one Project (40%) and Skills Demonstration (60%).
